Bottom Line Up Front:

A second upper-level system will bring us a quick shot of lowland rain and mountain snow.

- Snow:
 - A narrow band of moderate to heavy snow, accompanied by strong wind gusts, will move across the Gila Region this evening, producing brief, hazardous snow squall conditions
 - Snow will change to rain as the band pushes into the lowlands
 - Snowfall 1-3" above 6000' with locally higher amounts at the highest elevations
 - Most precip will fall between 5PM and 8PM for the Gila; 9PM to Midnight for Sacramento Mtns
- Wind:
 - Blustery west winds, gusts 35-45 MPH, highest across mountains and east slope areas
 - Blowing snow and white out conditions in portions of the mountains
- Cold Temperatures:
 - Near Zero Wind Chill Values in the Sacramento Mountains Thursday Night into the weekend
 - Teens and Twenties for Wind Chill Values in the Lowlands

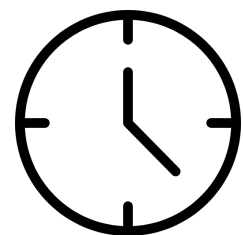

Gila/Black Range in Grant County**







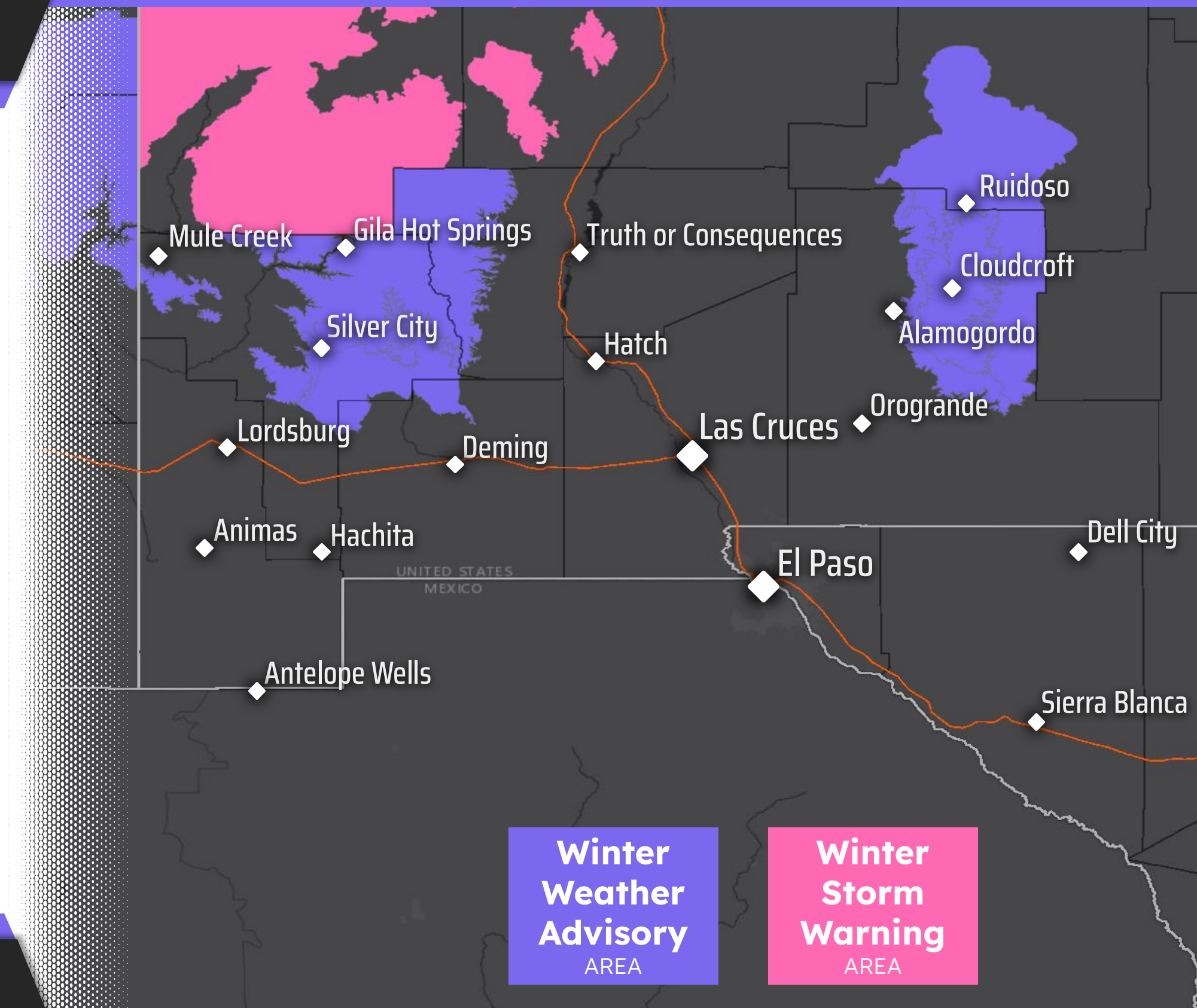
Additional Accumulations:

- Less than 1" for 5000-6000'
- Plan on slippery road conditions
- Poor visibility
- Monitor latest forecast and warnings

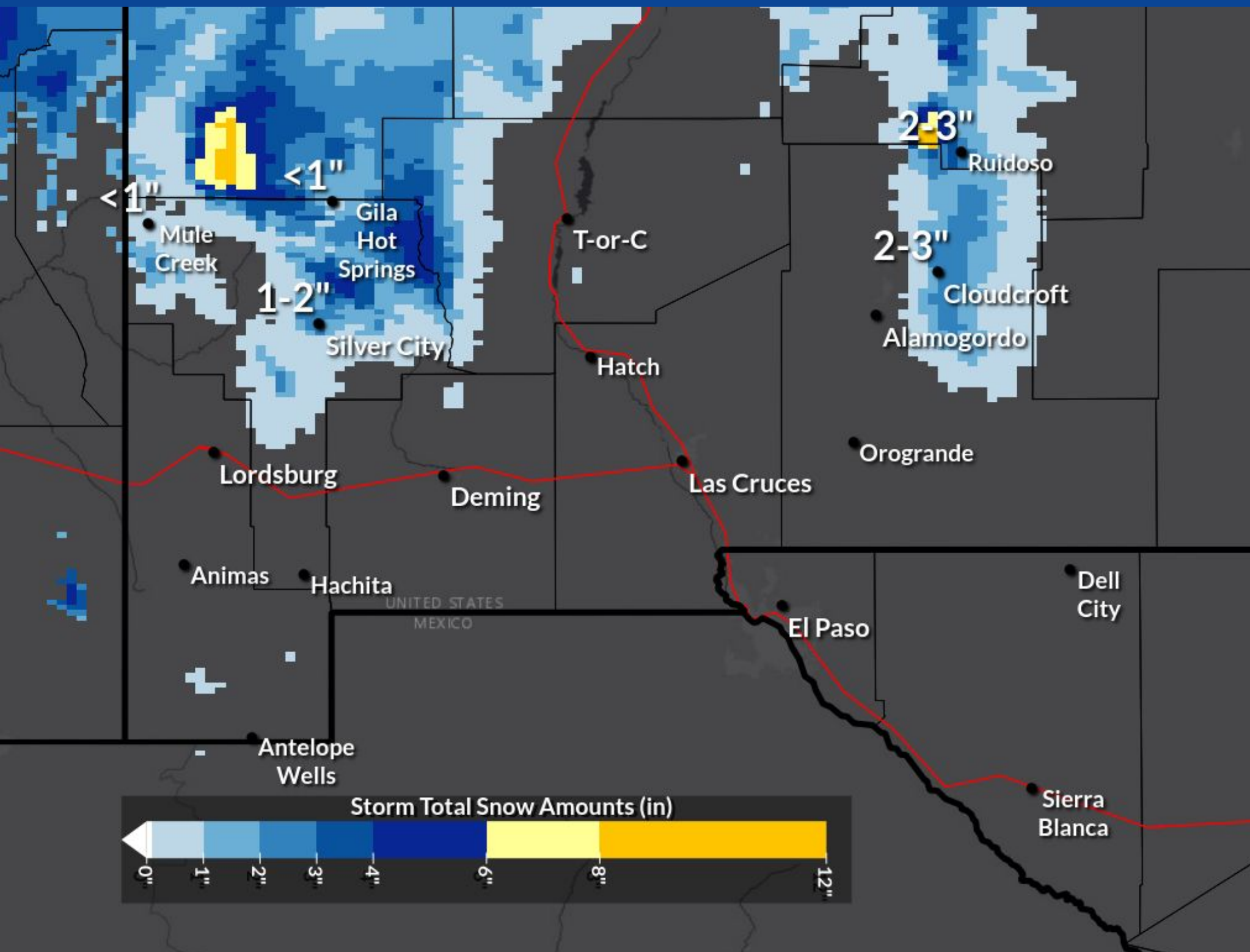

Additional Snowfall Forecast - January 8, 2026



→ Additional Mountain Snow This Evening

A second system will bring a **quick burst of moderate to heavy snow this evening**. The bulk of the snow will fall between 5PM and 8PM for the Gila, and 9PM and Midnight for the Sacramento Mountains. Snow levels will rapidly drop from 6000 to 5000'.

Additional Forecast Snow Totals:





- ◆ Cloudcroft: 1-3" (30% chance for less than 1")
- ◆ Emory Pass: 3-6"
- ◆ Mescalero: 1-3"
- ◆ Pinos Altos, Lake Roberts: 1-3"
- ◆ Timberon, Mayhill: Around 1"
- ◆ Silver City: 1-2"

→ Actions and Preparedness

- Monitor local news and [weather.gov](https://www.weather.gov) for latest forecasts
- Slick travel with poor visibility for portions of US-70, US-82, NM-15, and NM-152. Plan ahead and use caution when traveling over mountain passes.

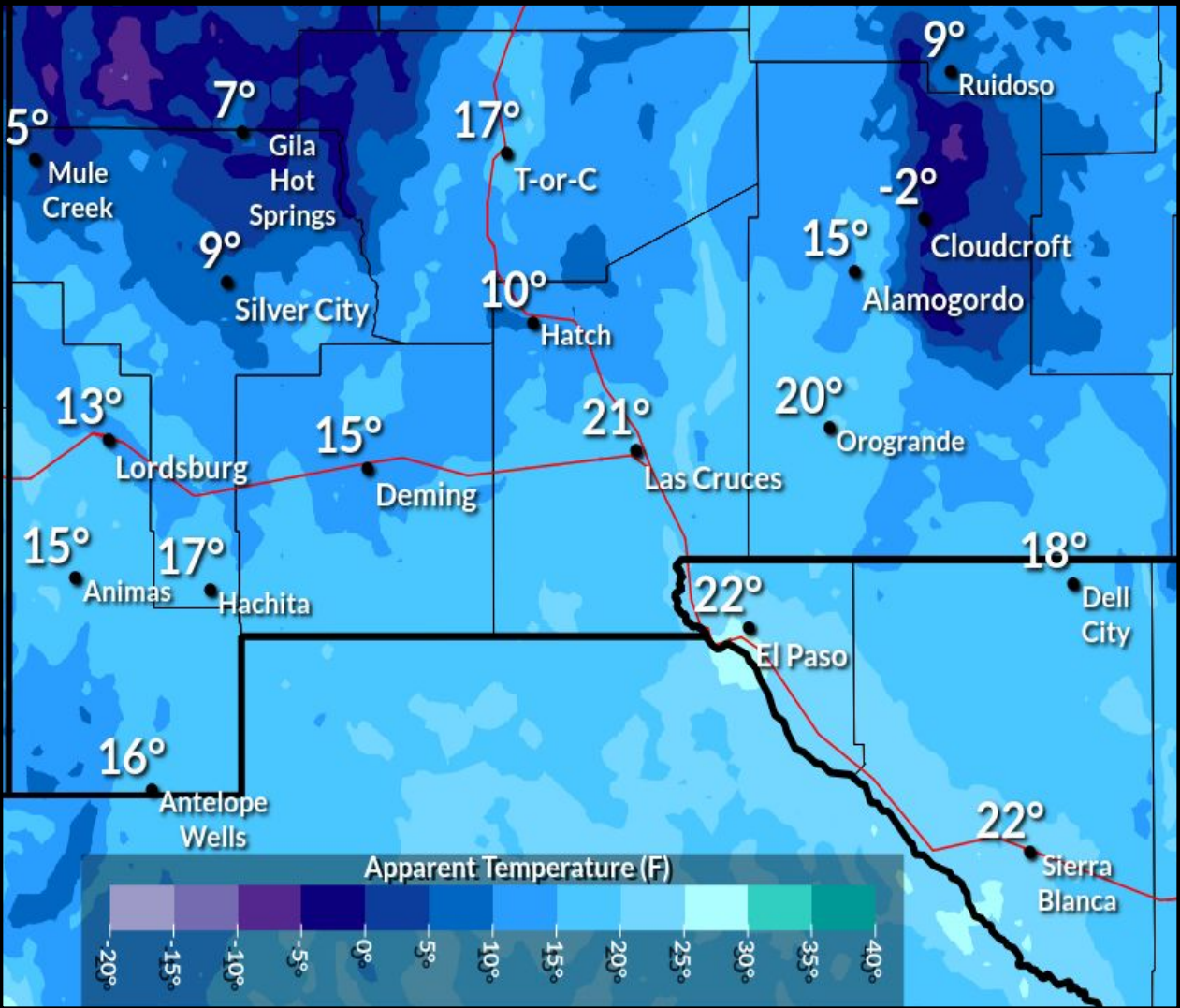
Weekend Wind Chill Temperatures

- 10 to 25 degrees over the desert lowlands

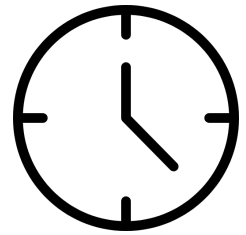

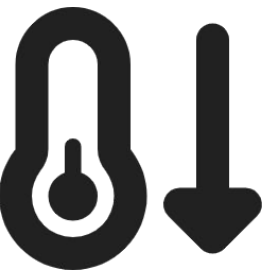
Bitterly Cold Wind Chills Friday and Saturday Morning



3 AM Friday to 10 AM Saturday

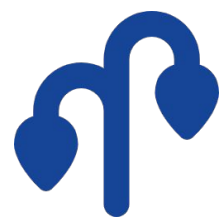
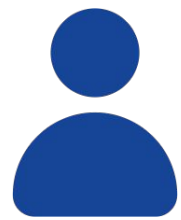


Gila and Sacramento Mountains

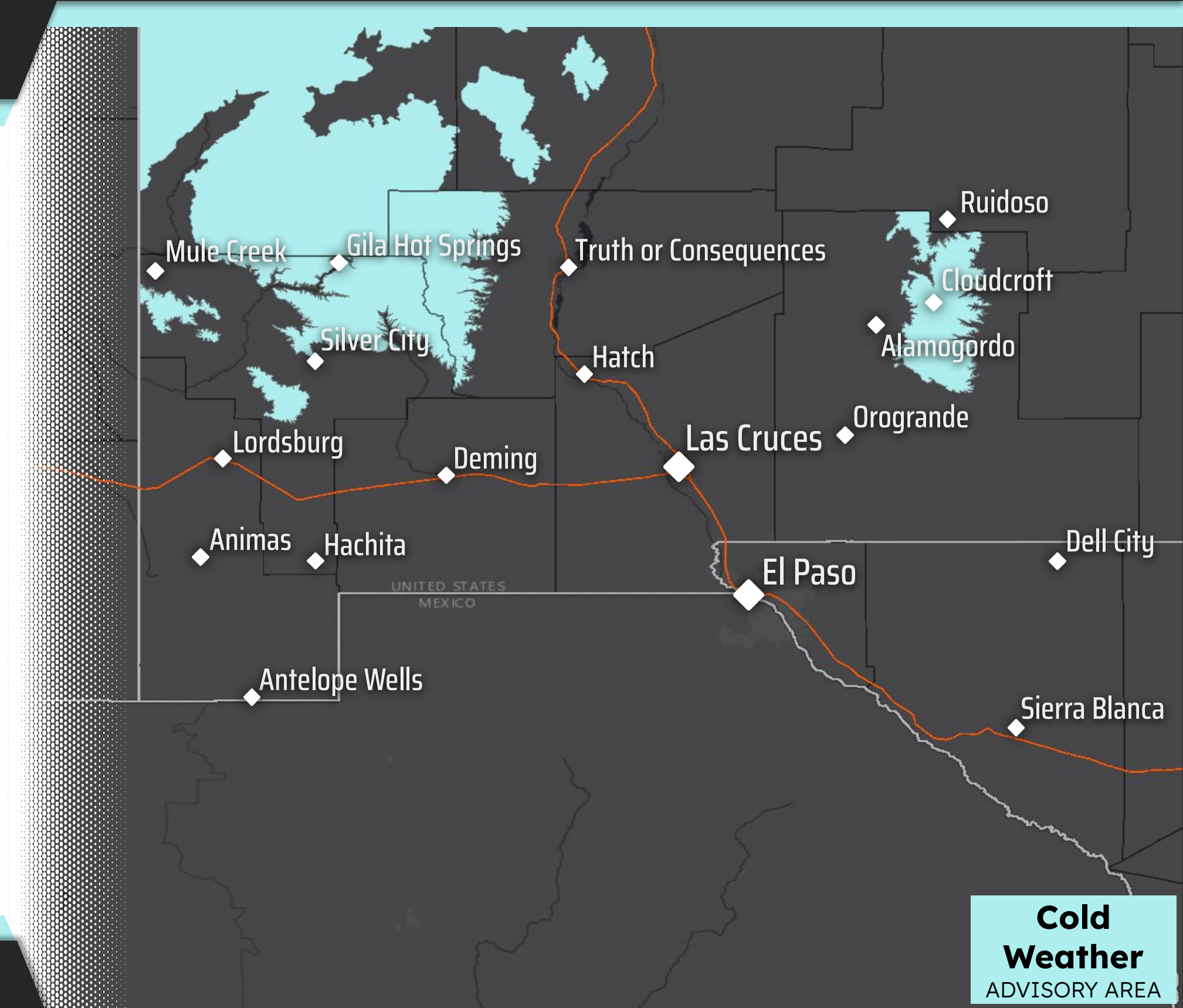

Clean off your vehicle before driving.
Flying snow from cars causes accidents.



Keep it slow, and don't use cruise control.
Roads can be slick even if they just look wet.



Leave extra distance between vehicles.
Stay especially far from snow plows.
